TACKLING THE COST OF LIVING

•£94 billion cost of living support package. This will help millions, including extra support for the most vulnerable: low income households, pensioners and disabled people.

•Energy Price Guarantee. Extending the Energy Price Guarantee at the current level until the end of June 2023 and keeping the Guarantee in place until 2024, helping every household – by keeping typical household bills to £2,500.

•National Insurance Contributions cut. Putting more money in your pocket by cutting NICs by 1.25% – saving 27.8 million an average of £330 in 2023-24.

BOOSTING OUR NHS

• Increasing NHS funding for the next three years. On top of previously announced increases, we are providing extra funding of $\pounds 6.6$ billion for the NHS and $\pounds 7.5$ billion for adult social care for the next three years – taking total health spending to $\pounds 192$ billion per year.

• **£3.7 billion hospital building programme.** We are building 40 hospitals by 2030, and opening up to 160 new Community Diagnostic Centres by 2025.

• **Cutting Covid-19 backlogs.** Launching the biggest catchup programme in the NHS's history, with around 9 million more checks, scans and procedures by 2026.

• **Recruiting more doctors and nurses.** The latest data shows we have a record 1.2 million full-time equivalent staff in the NHS in England – over 34,000 more people compared to a year ago, including almost 4,000 more doctors and over 9,300 more nurses.

• **Reforming health and social care.** Reducing bureaucracy, helping to plan health and care services around patients' needs, and making NHS England more accountable to taxpayers.

WORLD CLASS EDUCATION



We believe the best way to level up and deliver social progress is to give every child a world-class education. Consequently, we are delivering the biggest boost to school funding in a decade, setting up hundreds of free schools, and ensuring pupils with Special Educational Needs are not left out.

• Education funding boosted by an additional £14.4 billion over three years. The biggest school funding increase in years means every primary school will receive at least $\pounds4,405$ per pupil, and every secondary school at least $\pounds5,715$ per pupil, an uplift of over $\pounds1,500$.

• Helping schools with rising costs by boosting school budgets by £4 billion over two years. We are delivering £4 billion in additional funding for schools over the next two years to help schools with rising costs as a result of inflation.

• Tripling investment in Special Educational Needs infrastructure. We are building additional SEN and social care places, to help every young person fulfil their potential no matter what their circumstances; there will be 35 new special free schools for SEN pupils.

Education Investment Areas and a new levelling up premium. EIAs will ensure talented pupils can succeed wherever they are. The premium is worth up to £3,000 per teacher, supporting re-

cruitment and retention of teachers in shortage subjects and in the schools that need them most. **Education Recovery Plan worth £5 billion.** The Plan helped pupils recover from lost learning during the pandemic. It included tutoring for around 6 million pupils and over £200 million for summer schools. There was £400 million to boost remote education, including 1.3 million devices for students most in need

Theo Clarke MP to lead the First Debate on Birth Trauma in the History of Parliament

I'm delighted to announce that following my campaign on birth trauma, I will be leading the UK Parliament's first ever debate in our history on this topic. It will take place next week on Thursday 19th October in the House of Commons.

I will be asking the Government to add birth trauma to the Women's Health Strategy. I will also be sharing my personal story of birth trauma and the work of the new All Party Parliamentary Group for Birth Trauma which I chair with Labour MP Rosie Duffield. I have been humbled by the response to our cross-party national campaign.



This is a huge opportunity to improve the after care for mums across the UK. The debate will also coincide with Baby Loss Awareness Week. The debate was announced by Leader of the Commons Rt Hon Penny Mordaunt MP.Thank you to so many mums for bravely writing to me and sharing their stories and for support from Birth Trauma Association - UK The MASIC Foundation and inspiring campaigner Stoma Chameleon.

Gavin Shows Support for British Trucking Industry

Sir Gavin Williamson is delighted to reveal an upgrade in local facilities for lorry drivers.

The Department for Transport has announced an impressive £8 million funding for the improvement of facilities catering to heavy goods vehicles (HGV). Sir Gavin was pleased to hear of plans to dedicate £169,500 to The Hollies Truckstop in Cannock and an additional £35,000 to the Standeford Farm Café in Wolverhampton. The increased funding aims to substantially upgrade welfare amenities, such as showers, rest areas and dining establishments, while also expanding HGV parking capacity.



The improvements shall in turn support trading links up and down the country, and this should bolster the vitality of South Staffordshire communities.

Sir Gavin Williamson has expressed his enthusiasm for this development, emphasising its significance not only to the transport industry, but also to the broader Staffordshire constituency. He said 'HGV drivers are key contributors to our economy. Their unwavering dedication during the pandemic was nothing short of remarkable, and I am pleased that they will be able to enjoy the benefits of our enhanced local facilities'.

With lorry drivers being required to take mandatory breaks and rest periods, upgrading roadside facilities will improve the quality of HGV drivers rest and recovery. This in turn makes our roads feel safer.

Gavin Backs a Greener Staffordshire

Sir Gavin Williamson visited Brewood Park Farm to learn more about efforts to protect and enhance nature in Staffordshire.

Sir Gavin Williamson attended a Climate Commission event and met with members of the National Farmers' Union, including Staffordshire County Advisor Jeremy Lowe, to learn more about what can be done to prevent climate change and to celebrate Staffordshire's rich natural environment.

During the event, Sir Gavin took part in bird ringing, a



practice which provides insights into a bird's lifespan and daily movement patterns, and learned about how this practice in particular contributes to bird conservation efforts. The Commission, which was set up in 2021, is following in the footsteps of other Climate Commissions across the UK which aim to bring together people from public, private, and civic sectors to work collaboratively to drive forward climate action and nature recovery. Commission Signatories include the NHS, Keele University, NFU, NatWest, and Staffordshire County Council.

Sir Gavin said: "It was heart-warming to see the diverse range of organisations coming together through the Climate Commission to work towards a greener Staffordshire. Such events play a pivotal role in driving forward climate action and nature restoration, which our beautiful county will reap the rewards from for years to come. I would like to thank all Commission Signatories for their remarkable contributions in sustaining and enhancing the wildlife of Staffordshire."

Gavin Calls for Cuts to NHS Waiting Times

Sir Gavin Williamson recently attended a parliamentary drop-in with Macmillan Cancer Support with over 170 MPs to discuss the failings of the cancer care system and to advocate for improvements to the treatment of cancer diagnosis in the NHS.

Sir Gavin joined Macmillan Cancer Support on Wednesday 13th September to call for the government to get on top of NHS waiting times which are detrimental to the effective treatment of cancer patients. Data shared by Macmillan Cancer Support demonstrates that at least 100,000 people across the UK have had their condition



worsen due to a shortage in available appointments. This has been a gradual development over the last decade, escalating of course due to the disruption of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Sir Gavin was especially keen to lend his voice towards addressing delays in cancer care, thinking of his constituents. The need for cuts to waiting times is particularly stark in South Staffordshire, explicit in the fact that earlier this year 426 cancer patients had to wait longer than 62 days for a referral to specialist treatment at the Royal Wolverhampton NHS Trust. As such, Sir Gavin has prioritised work with Macmillan Cancer Support and plans to meet again at the Conservative Party Conference next week to discuss what he can do further. Sir Gavin said: "I will do anything I can do help Macmillan with their campaign to correct NHS waiting times for cancer patients. This is particularly relevant to my constituents in South Staffordshire, and I look forward to meeting again with representatives from the charity very soon to talk about next steps regarding campaigning government."

Gavin Supports Penkridge Volunteers

Sir Gavin Williamson recently took part in Penkridge Volunteers Day, an event organised by Penkridge Parish Council and Support Staffordshire to spotlight volunteering opportunities in the local area.

Sir Gavin spoke to the organisation behind the event, Support Staffordshire, which provides assistance to voluntary and community groups through advice and development services. The network which Support Staffordshire enables local organisations to tap into offers opportunities for collaboration and wider access to the support of volunteers.



Sir Gavin said: "It was a real treat to speak with volunteers and charities from the communities I support, to discuss the ways in which we can join forces to help sustain the volunteering sector in these areas. The work of Support Staffordshire is truly a pillar for the volunteer groups in my constituency, and I applaud the incredible work that they do. I encourage anyone who can to get involved with volunteering in their local area, as it can be a really rewarding community to be a part of."

Gavin Leads the Way for Defibrillator Charity

Sir Gavin Williamson has shown support for the Staffordshire charity AED donate, meeting with the founder, Jamie Richards, to discuss what he can do to push for the expansion of their life-saving work. He's also called for the government to re-assess its current contract with certain defibrillator companies that don't register all their defibrillators with the emergency services. AED donate works with local communities to help them fundraise and purchase defibrillators, then assists by advising where they should be placed, setting them up, and registering them with the local ambulance service.



Sir Gavin was thoroughly impressed by the progress of Jamie and his team. They've managed to increase the average availability of defibrillators from 67% to 97.9%, and have promised that after use, the defibrillator can be serviced and up-and-running again within 4 hours.

Sir Gavin was keen to stress the relevance of this work for his constituents and those in the wider area. It's a sobering thought that 3,600 heart attacks a year in the West Midlands occur outside of hospitals, so the work of Jamie and his team has the potential to significantly reduce cardiac-attack related deaths. The team were keen to stress the particular virtues of their organisation, stating that current government contracts are failing to register all of their defibrillators with emergency services. This feature is critical, as it alerts the local paramedic team that the defibrillator has been used so the patient can be cared for as soon as possible.

Responding to this, Sir Gavin felt it necessary to contact the Minister for Health and Social Care, to suggest a re-assessment of existing contracts. Jamie Richards said: "As a charity we pride ourselves on the in-depth service that we provide to ensure that all people, of any ability, are comfortable enough to be able to save a life if they should need to. The charity's objectives over the next three years are to continue to put defibrillators into communities nationally with the aim of placing 1,500 defibrillators per year."

Sir Gavin said: "I really must applaud the work of Jamie and his team, who are clearly so passionate about the project that they're pursuing. They will be a lifeline for many, especially in Staffordshire, which suffers from a lack of community defibrillators. Considering around 12,000 in South Staffordshire currently live with heart and circulatory diseases, I can't stress enough how important it is to build our stock of emergency equipment in case the unthinkable happens. This is why I'm contacting the Minister for Health and Social Care, to see if more support can be given to charities like these, and to address current contractors who don't properly register their equipment."

Thousands expected for big Christmas lights switch on in Stafford

Stafford is set for the biggest party of the year on Saturday 18 November when the annual Christmas lights switch-on takes place in the town's newly renovated Market Square.

Throughout the day there will be stalls, street theatre, traditional fair rides, Christmas shopping events and a special appearance by Father Christmas himself at the Ancient High House and then on the main stage in the Market Square.

Shoppers will be able to take part in a special Christmas Trail organised by Stafford Borough Council, offering prizes at shops, cafes and the Gatehouse Theatre.

Stars of this year's Beauty and the Beast pantomime will keep the crowd entertained on the main stage and there will also be a DJ and live music acts from 3pm onwards.

The festive extravaganza, managed by Freedom Leisure, is expected to attract thousands of people to the town with the council saying the event provides the perfect showcase for Stafford as a great place for people to do their Christmas shopping.

The Mayor of Stafford Borough, Councillor Andy Cooper, and Santa himself will arrive just before 5pm for the traditional countdown, followed by a spectacular fireworks display. After that, the Cartoon Kings will be back with another set before the stage closes at 6pm.

Countdown on for half term opening of park in Stone

The countdown is on until fencing comes down at a park in Stone to signal the opening of brand new play facilities in time for the school half term break.

Westbridge Park is undergoing a major £1.5m transformation and from Saturday (28 October) youngsters will be able to play on fantastic new equipment, ride on the double zip wire, and have a go in the multi-use games area (MUGA).

Although the scheme - which includes wheeled sports bowl, toilets, enhanced pathways, and landscaping - is on track to be completed later in November, Stafford Borough Council has opened the children's facilities for the start of the half term holidays.

Refurbished Stafford Square to host its first event to mark re-opening

The first event to take place at the newly refurbished Market Square in Stafford takes place this weekend.

The official opening on Saturday (28 October) gets underway at 12 noon and organisers promise a feast of free entertainment for residents, shoppers, and visitors.

Fines for litter louts and fly-tippers hiked in zero-tolerance crackdown

Litter louts and fly-tippers in South Staffordshire will now face higher fines than ever in a council crackdown on offenders.

South Staffordshire Council has increased its fees for fixed penalty notices. Fines for fly-tipping have increased from £400 to £1,000, fines for littering have increased from £75 to £500, and fines for those found guilty of a Household Duty of Care offence have risen from £200 to £600.

The new charges will be implemented with immediate effect.

South Staffs Council shortlisted for UK Planning Authority of the Year award

South Staffordshire Council has been shortlisted for the UK Planning Authority of the Year award.

It is among just seven authorities across the country to be in the running for the prestigious national accolade from the Royal Town Planning Institute (RTPI).

The shortlisting follows South Staffordshire Council's success in being named RTPI Planning Authority of the Year - West Midlands back in June. The summer ceremony also saw the authority scoop the RTPI Chair's Special Award for staff development and progression.

Lead planning manager at the council, Kelly Harris, has also been shortlisted for the national Inspirational Leader of the Year award by RTPI. She is among just eight leaders from across the UK to have made it to the shortlist.

The winners for both awards will be revealed at a ceremony in London on Tuesday, November 21.

New scheme to champion business success in South Staffs

A new Government-backed programme, championing business success and prosperity in South Staffordshire, is set to officially launch later this month.

Enterprise in South Staffs will be launched at a showcase event at Codsall Community Hub on Tuesday, October 24th.

The programme, created by South Staffordshire Council, in partnership with Stoke-on-Trent and Staffordshire Growth Hub, brings together inspiration and insight to give businesses in the district the opportunity to grow and thrive.

Enterprise in South Staffs has received £3.82 million from the UK Government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund, with an additional £489,391 allocated to support the area's rural community and business infrastructure.

Who may be a candidate?

To stand for your local council you must be over 18 years of age AND a British citizen; a Commonwealth citizen; a qualifying EU citizen; or an EU citizen with retained rights, AND resident in the UK.

In addition, one of the following criteria must apply to you:

You must be and continue to be a local government elector for the area of the local authority.

OR

You must have, during the whole of the twelve months preceding both nomination day and the day of the election, occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the area of the local authority.

OR

Your principal or only place of work in the twelve months preceding your nomination day and the day of the election must have been in the area of the local authority.

OR

You must have, during the whole of the twelve months preceding both your nomination day and the day of the election resided in the area of the local authority.

Do I know enough to stand for election?

Don't underestimate your own abilities. Each councillor will have something different to offer the council and you will not be expected to take direct responsibility for running the council on the first day that you are elected.

Your main qualifications are a genuine concern for the community and a willingness to learn. Knowledge and experience will soon follow.



Have I the time to be a councillor?

The time commitment involved in being a councillor will vary depending on the responsibilities you decide to take on.

Many councillors have work and family commitments as well as other interests which they successfully balance with their role as a councillor.
