Stafford Station Gateway Project receives £20 million of Government Funding



Stafford MP Theo Clarke has told of her delight that the Stafford Station Gateway project has received £20 million from the government's Levelling Up Fund.

The Levelling up secretary of state Michael Gove was invited to Stafford by Theo to announce the money this morning (20th November). The scheme failed in the last round of bids but Theo has worked hard with ministers to ensure it was awarded the cash from the round 3 pot. The scheme will bring back into use underutilised land around the station and it includes 900 homes, 30,000sq ft of commercial space and a hotel.

The work will complement other government investment in the Shire Hall and through the Future High Street Fund that is already transforming the town centre.

"I am absolutely delighted this money has been awarded to the borough council to ensure this project will have spades in the ground backed by this substantial funding to ensure it is high-quality and successful," said Theo.

"It has been a long road to get to this point following the disappointment of last year but I have never given up. I worked to understand the reasons why the last bid fell at the last hurdle and I met with two levelling up ministers to make the case that government money levelling up money could be put to good use here in Stafford. I would like to thank the secretary of state, the levelling up minister Jacob Young and his predecessor Dehenna Davison for working with me on this scheme. It will make a huge difference to our town."

Michael Gove said: "I am delighted to be in Stafford with Theo Clarke MP to announce this major investment from round 3 of the Levelling Up Fund. Theo has campaigned tirelessly to help secure nearly £20 million to transform the station area of Stafford, and today her hard work has paid off. She is a brilliant advocate for her constituents and I look forward to working with her and the local council to deliver this project for the people of Stafford."

Gavin Combats Anti-Social Behaviour in Local Parks

Sir Gavin Williamson has recently met with South Staffordshire District Council to address anti-social behaviour in and around Cavans Wood and Shoal Hill Common.

Sir Gavin has engaged in discussions with the Council, Forestry England and the local police relating to the recent spate of disruptive behaviour, in particular the influx of off-road bikes into the restricted area, as well as the disposal of waste and non-recyclables into the park. Locals have been rightfully frustrated about the lack of care and respect given to their communal parks and the wildlife which lives within them.



All were unanimous in the decision to escalate the use of Section 54 ASB notices in order to clamp down on the issue. This should enable the local authorities the use of appropriate powers to seize equipment which is operating in restricted areas.

Sir Gavin said: "I'm really relieved by the results of today's discussions, and hope to see the implementation of the Section 54 notices to positive effect. The unacceptable treatment of our communal areas and green spaces is something that I'm keen to get under control. By collaborating with the local authorities and local council, I'm pleased to say this issue should be resolved as soon as possible, and the people of South Staffordshire will be able to enjoy the value of Shoal Hill Common and Cavans Wood as untouched natural spaces."

Gavin Takes Action Against Speed Racing

Sir Gavin Williamson has demanded action on concerns regarding road racing on the A449 near Coven, and has called on Staffordshire Police to get this under control.

Sir Gavin has been working with Staffordshire police to campaign for further legal restrictions on road racing. Local residents have been troubled by the street racing gatherings for some years, and a recent spate of crashes and speeding incidents in the area have



expedited demands for something to be done. Sir Gavin has called for regular patrols and car cruising injunctions as a way to tackle the issue. A funding settlement for the police for the year 2023/2024 will total £17.2 billion, so it is hoped that the extra funding can be directed towards the issue.

Sir Gavin said: "I've been meeting with Staffordshire Police to prioritise the issue of street racing and to call for further legal measures that will deter those from joining street racing gatherings. Not only are they a source of anxiety for the nearby public, but they demonstrate dangerous and irresponsible driving that could cause real damage. I've listened to the concerns my constituents have voiced on stunt driving and will push for something to be done."

Gavin Supports RSPCA Campaign

Sir Gavin Williamson has voiced his support for the work of the RSPCA in the face of puppy smuggling, live exports of animals, pet theft and livestock worrying.

Sir Gavin recently attended a parliamentary event to discuss possible improvements to animal welfare. The charity is pushing for changes in the laws regarding puppy smuggling, a cause which Sir Gavin has frequently lent his voice to. Where UK breeders are unable to meet demands for puppies, around 10 to 50% of dogs are imported illegally. Within these routes it is difficult to regulate health

and welfare standards, and as such something must be done.



Sir Gavin said: "It was great to meet with the team from the RSPCA and discuss how to impose further regulations on the keep and trade of animals. I've always had a deep passion for animals and own dogs myself. I'm therefore keen to support the RSPCA's work and am in full support of their petition for a Bill which would regulate puppy imports and prevent the abuse inherent in the illegal dog trade."

Gavin Celebrates Re-opening of Local Rugby Club

Sir Gavin Williamson recently visited the Essington Rugby Club to attend the opening ceremony for their new facilities.

Sir Gavin met with the team to congratulate them on recently raising funds to improve the club house and grounds. Essington Rugby Club meets weekly for training sessions, as well as several social events throughout the month, providing a great sense of community for all those involved. The team greeted Sir Gavin with a plate to thank his attendance at the opening. Sir Gavin intended to



attend a game between Essington Rugby Club and St Leonards RUFC, however, the game was cancelled due to the tragic loss of a St Leonard's player on the morning of the game.

Sir Gavin said: "It has been a real pleasure to meet with those at Essington Rugby, who have been dedicated to improving the facilities at the club, and have done a fabulous job. I'm always keen to support community sport endeavours, as it is so important to stay physically active at the same time as it is wonderful to have such a sociable team. The match due to occur between Essington Rugby and St Leonard's was cancelled due to the tragic loss of a St Leonard's player that morning. I'd like to offer his family and friends my deepest condolences at such a difficult time."

Council say it with flowers for life saving charity in Stafford Borough

A floral tribute to mark the work of the Samaritans will take centre stage at award-winning parks in Stafford and Stone.

The flowers in the carpet beds at Victoria Park in Stafford and Stonefield Park in Stone will be designed to honour the charity which has been running for 70 years. The Samaritans were founded in November 1953 and have had a branch in Stafford for 60 years.

The beds in the park have previously commemorated major events - such as the Platinum Jubilee of the late Queen Elizabeth II in 2022 and a tribute to the coronation of King Charles III this summer - as well as honouring the NHS, armed forces and several charities and organisations that do great work to benefit the borough.

The Samaritans has around 22,000 volunteers with more than 200 branches and locations across the UK and Ireland. They provide confidential and emotional support, in a range of ways, to those in need of a safe space to talk - and every 10 seconds the charity responds to a call for help.

At a meeting in September Stafford Borough Council unanimously agreed to plant a tree in Victoria Park to show appreciation for the work of the Samaritans.

Warm welcome rolled out across Stafford Borough

A network of venues will be made available this winter to keep residents in Stafford Borough warm as temperatures drop.

The scheme proved successful when it was rolled out last year with around 20 premises including village halls and community centres taking part.

Call for Stafford Borough Businesses to grab share of cash

Businesses in Stafford Borough are being urged to grab a share of a £240,000 pot. The money has come from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF) and is part of the government's Levelling Up agenda.

It has been earmarked to support small and medium rural businesses whose income is predominantly from sales to other businesses.

The money can be used in a variety of ways, such as improving a website, marketing campaign, or advertising new products - and already 20 local businesses have benefited from the fund.

The 'Rural Business to Business' fund is aimed at companies in rural areas looking to branch out to new markets or create new products and services - and where the sales to other businesses make up a minimum of 75 percent of their income.

One of the successful recipients was award winning film and media marketing company, Lilac Howell Films, who used a £5,000 grant to help purchase new equipment and expand their business. Lilac Howell Managing Director, Steve Cranston, said: "We are grateful for this funding from the borough council which has helped us purchase camera equipment as well as other technological equipment to develop our service."

Warning signs to put brakes on car cruisers in South Staffordshire

Signs warning against the anti-social use of vehicles have been installed along the A449 Stafford Road in South Staffordshire, as South Staffordshire Police continue to crackdown on street cruising.

The signs warn motorists that a Section 59 notice is in force. This gives our officers authority to seize vehicles being driven in an anti-social manner in the area.

They are located from the A449/M54 junction to the island junction with Brewood Road, on the north and southbound carriageways.

It comes after reports from residents of motorists gathering in groups late at night, driving at excess speeds, sounding horns, playing loud music and revving engines.

Leader of South Staffordshire Council, Councillor Roger Lees, said: "We are painfully aware of the nuisance and danger car cruising can pose for local residents.

"With this in mind, we are working hard alongside Staffordshire Police on the campaign work to deter car cruisers along the A449, the A460, and further afield. This includes the pursuit of a High Court Injunction in the area.

"We are also engaging with neighbouring authorities with a view to achieving a cross-border solution to car cruising."

Pc Wayne Green, from the South Staffordshire LPT, said: "The Section 59 warning notices count as a first warning to motorists who drive in an anti-social manner.

"We are currently in the process of working on securing a High Court injunction, which if granted will forbid anyone from taking part in street cruising in the area, or from promoting it.

"Officers are gathering evidence by engaging with local residents whose lives are blighted by this illegal activity. The signs will serve as a deterrent and offer much-needed reassurance to the local community while we do this.

"Please be in no doubt; any motorist caught driving in an anti-social manner, or without due care and attention, will have their vehicle seized under Section 59 of the Police Reform Act 2002."

Section 59 signs will also be installed at the start of the M54, heading along the A460 Cannock Road towards Shareshill.

Access Enterprise in South Staffs will include a business marketplace with a variety of partner stalls exhibiting and refreshments available.

Guests will be welcomed to Codsall Community Hub from 9.30am on Tuesday, October 24th, with the business marketplace open from 10am to 1pm.

Support for businesses and working people welcomed by county council leader

Support for small businesses, working people and measures to help people with day-to-day cost of living challenges set out in the Chancellor's Autumn Statement have been welcomed by the leader of Staffordshire County Council Alan White.

Alan White said: We welcome measures outlined by the Chancellor which can help to put more money in people's pockets to meet daily living cost challenges, with the working population standing to benefit from changes



to both National Insurance contributions and an elevated living wage. This will make a difference to Staffordshire residents – where we have had long-term low unemployment and continue to generate numerous job vacancies. Plans submitted for first all-through school in Staffordshire

A planning application has been submitted for the first all-through school to be built in Staffordshire.



If agreed, the school will be built on the former Rugeley Power Station site in Rugeley, owned by ENGIE, which is to be transformed into a sustainable and innovative neighbourhood.

The school will accommodate up to 420 primary and 750 secondary school pupils, as well as a 52 place nursery and 200 place sixth form.

As well as the all-through school, plans include a multi-use games area, sports pitches, sports hall and car parking.

It will be run by the John Taylor Multi Academy Trust, which already runs a number of successful primary and secondary schools in Staffordshire.

Plans have been submitted by BAM Construct UK Ltd, who have been appointed by the Department for Education to construct the all-through school.

The Department for Education are funding the school as part of the government's Free Schools programme, along with a substantial contribution from ENGIE and contributions from Staffordshire County Council.

The school is scheduled to open its doors to both primary and secondary school pupils in September 2025 and will address the growing need for school places in Rugeley.

Staffordshire County Council Cabinet Member for Education Jonathan Price said:

"After months of planning and negotiations, we have reached a crucial step in the development of this school. The next step will be gaining planning permission, before construction can start in earnest. I look forward to seeing the school take shape over the next couple of years.

"Building this school is incredibly important, as it means we can address pressures on school places locally and add much needed capacity in the area."

Mike Donoghue, Chief Executive Office of the John Taylor Multi Academy Trust said:

"John Taylor Multi-Academy Trust is delighted to be advised that significant progress toward the opening of Staffordshire's first all-through provision has been made. We are incredibly enthusiastic about the proposals, ambitious for the school as a centre of learning and engagement, and committed to delivering provision of which the community will be proud."

A spokesperson for ENGIE UK said:

"We are delighted that another important milestone has been reached in the next chapter of Rugeley Power Station's long history. The school is an integral part of the plans to transform the site into a sustainable and innovative community, and will be an important addition to the local educational provision.

"ENGIE, is pleased to have reached an agreement to provide the 7HA of land for the development of the school, along with its contribution to the school construction, road access and infrastructure to service the school."

More than 16,000 potholes repaired across Staffordshire so far this year

Staffordshire County Council is making good on its promise to fix more roads across the county with 16,308 pothole repair jobs completed so far.

A 'job' is, on average, two or three potholes at a time – meaning the number of potholes filled across the county is likely to be double or even triple that figure. In 2022, Staffordshire Highways filled 16,039 carriageway potholes, significantly exceeding the national Local Authority average of 11,229. This year has already seen crews surpass their 2022 total.



Earlier this year, SCC announced an investment of £30 million into maintaining and improving the county's highways over the next two years. This is on top of the £5 million funding for road repairs and £4.8 million received from the Department for Transport's pothole fund.

Some of this money has been invested in groundbreaking AI technology that identifies and categorises potholes as well as innovative machinery, like the JCB Pothole Pro, to repair defects.

Two million pounds from the pothole fund has enabled county councillors to prioritise non-urgent nuisance potholes reported locally.

Staffordshire will additionally be receiving over £186 million of the £8.3 billion government investment into England's roads for the next 11 years. This funding became available following the cancellation of HS2 north of Birmingham.

Residents can report potholes on the county council's website, using the 'Report It' function. Repairs are then prioritised depending on the severity and dangerousness of the defect.

Cabinet Member for Highways and Transport at Staffordshire County Council, David Williams (pictured with a thermal road repairs machine), said:

"We inspect over 1,200 miles of roads and footways each month to check for safety defects because we know how important it is to keep our highways well maintained.

"These figures show that Staffordshire County Council is well above the national average when it comes to pothole repairs and it is something we are very proud of. On average, our crews fill a pothole every eight minutes.

"To deliver on our promise to fix more of our county's roads, we have invested £30 million on cutting edge technology, including use of artificial intelligence and the innovative JCB Pothole Pro, to detect and repair defects."

Staff and pupils celebrate official opening of their new school building

Staff and pupils at St Leonard's Primary school in Stafford have celebrated the 'official' opening of their new school building.

After outgrowing their previous Victorian building, St Leonard's has moved to the former Kingston Centre on Fairway, a five minute walk away.

The Centre—previously a school from 1939 to 1988 underwent a £4 million remodel and refurbishment over 36 weeks and was completed ready for the start of the Autumn Term.



Careful design meant the expanded school could be accommodated in the space without the need for extensions. The external space has also been remodelled and developed, with hard and soft play surfaces and a forest school.

Inside, the school now boasts modern teaching and non-teaching facilities, with the option to expand in the future to meet increased demand for pupil places from new housing developments in the area.

Added to this, the school is one of the most sustainable in the County with air source heat pumps, photovoltaic panels, hybrid heating / cooling air units, and insulated thermal ceiling tiles to reduce the carbon footprint of the building.

80 trees donated by the Woodland Trust were planted by pupils in the new grounds at the start of works. Bird and bat boxes have also been installed across the site, as well as bug hotels.

Midlands-based contractor G F Tomlinson and Entrust's architect and project manager worked with Staffordshire County Council to deliver the project.

Staffordshire County Council Cabinet Member for Education Jonathan Price said: "With St Leonard's outgrowing its old premises and needing to ensure there are sufficient school places in the local area to cope with housing developments, it made sense to bring the former Kingston Centre back into its original use, albeit with complete refurbishment.

"The school is now a vibrant, modern school with state-of-the-art facilities, and is one of the most sustainable in the County. The pupils and staff are incredibly happy with their new premises and I look forward to seeing the school grow over the next few years."

Headteacher Karen Roberts said: "We're incredibly lucky to have a fantastic building with wonderful outdoor space which the children absolutely love. It's been great to see them enjoying and using their brand new surroundings. The move to the new building marks the beginning of an exciting journey for all our pupils, and the St Leonard's school family. I'm really looking forward to seeing how our school can evolve and grow further over the next few years."

Who may be a candidate?

To stand for your local council you must be over 18 years of age AND a British citizen; a Commonwealth citizen; a qualifying EU citizen; or an EU citizen with retained rights, AND resident in the UK.

In addition, one of the following criteria must apply to you:

You must be and continue to be a local government elector for the area of the local authority.

OR

You must have, during the whole of the twelve months preceding both nomination day and the day of the election, occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the area of the local authority.

OR

Your principal or only place of work in the twelve months preceding your nomination day and the day of the election must have been in the area of the local authority.

OR

You must have, during the whole of the twelve months preceding both your nomination day and the day of the election resided in the area of the local authority.
